**Note:** This annex (integral part of the review) showcases the preliminary version of the Nationalized Sustainable Development Goals, with 14 prioritized goals and Georgia Nationalized 88 targets. It also defines responsible government authorities for each of the target. The nationalized matrix will be reviewed in 5-7 year span to expand and cover full scope of the 17 Sustainable Development Goals by 2030. The prioritization of the goals and targets was based on the national policy review and mapping exercise in connection with Sustainable Development Goals. By the time of submitting the first national voluntary review report, the work on establishing the national indicators is at its final stage. The set of baseline, complementary national indicators and quantitative projections for 2030 will be published by the second half of August in this year, subsequent to the consultations with civil society organizations and academia.
